EXT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH - DAY

They turn right and approach a closed door. The orderly looks into a facial recognition device. The door drops straight down. He steps aside and motions to Dr. Stevens to enter the room.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - DAY

Two late 60's men sit in the dimly lit room in casual yet elegant clothing. Dr. Stevens ambles in and stops a few feet in front of an empty chair.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS, a bald black man with horned rimmed glasses, and DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER, a white man with thick gray hair, acknowledge his presence with a nod.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Hello doctor. Good to see you again.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER How are you feeling?

HANNAH STEVENS, a cute woman in her early 30's, stands in the doorway from the POV of the bathroom mirror.

HANNAH STEVENS

Why are you ignoring me?

Mary Anne sees Hannah in the reflection. Her eyes soften as she turns to face Hannah.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Sorry. I was daydreaming.

Mary Anne looks at Hannah with anguish.

HANNAH STEVENS

Are you OK?

Mary Anne slowly shakes her head, looks downward, then back at Hannah.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I got a call today from the NIH.

Hannah cocks her head inquisitively.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) They said to expect a call later today from Claude and Darius.

Robert is sharply dressed in a pair of trousers, button down shirt and a Harris Tweed blazer. He quickly eats the last bite of toast, then finishes some orange juice. He turns and walks down the hallway.

INT. DR. ROBERT STEVENS APARTMENT BEDROOM - DAWN

The alarm clock shows 5:35am. Robert walks over to his sound asleep fiancée, kneels beside her and gently kisses her cheek.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS

I love you.

Mary Anne stirs but her eyes stay closed.

MARY ANNE BROOKINGS
I love you too. Have a great day, doctor.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS Thank you. And stop calling me that.

Mary Anne's eyes remain closed but her smile almost becomes a laugh.

EXT. STREETS OF WASHINGTON, DC - DAY

INT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH - DAY

DR. ROBERT STEVENS Hi sweet pea! Daddy missed you so much.

Robert kisses Hannah on the cheek. Mary Anne hurries over for a family hug and a quick kiss.

MARY ANNE STEVENS You're home early. How was your day?

Robert hands the flowers to Mary Anne, then picks up the wine and briefcase.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

CUT TO BLACK.

INT. STEVENS KITCHEN - DAY

Mary Anne is cleaning up breakfast dishes. Hannah sits in her high chair eating Cheerios. The phone rings. Mary Anne reaches behind her and picks up the phone.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Hello.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.)

Hi Mary Anne, it's Darius. Is Robert at home?

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Hi Darius. No, he left almost an hour ago.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.)

He's late for a meeting and he's never late.

EXT. STEVENS HOME - DAY

Two uniformed police officers make their way up the steps to the front porch.

INT. CHURCH - DAY

Mary Anne is dressed in black in the front row with Hannah on her lap. She holds her silver crucifix with her thumb and index finger. Claude and Darius sit beside her. At least 200 people are in attendance. A large portrait of Robert sits on an easel next to an urn. FATHER TUSHAR, late 50's, stands behind the pulpit.

FATHER TUSHAR

From Romans 14:8, "If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord".

I would now like to invite a colleague, mentor and close friend of Robert's, Dr. Claude Frazier, to say a few words.

Claude stands and walks to the pulpit. He slowly turns and makes eye contact with Mary Anne, then raises his head slightly.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
I'm so sorry Mary Anne. I'm not
sure I'll ever come to grips with
this. I can only imagine how hard
this is for you.

Mary Anne chokes back tears. She takes two deep breaths then looks out the window. She stares at idyllic scenes of couples, families, shops, restaurants and a playground. Darius slows down and takes a right turn onto a side street. He pulls over, stops the car and turns to Mary Anne.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) Mary Anne, I know this is the wrong time to bring this up, but did Robert share anything with you about his work?

MARY ANNE STEVENS What? What do you mean?

He stares at the phone on his desk for a couple seconds, then pushes a button to engage the speaker and dials a number. The phone rings three times.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Hello.

RUBIN BROWN

Hi Mary Anne. It's Rubin. Did I catch you at a good time?

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) To be honest Rubin, there aren't any good times.

A silent pause.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

I'm sorry. I shouldn't have said that. It's just-

RUBIN BROWN

No need to apologize. Do you have a few minutes?

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Of course.

RUBIN BROWN

I know it's only been a few days. If your not ready I understand, but Robert wanted you to have this urgently.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

What? Going over his will is the last thing I want.

RUBIN BROWN

It's not about that. Robert gave me something for you and said it was the final piece of the project.

Mary Anne's eyes bolt open.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Oh my God Rubin. Those were his exact words?

RUBIN BROWN

Yes. He seemed very relieved everything was in place just in case anything happened.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Ok. Tomorrow?

RUBIN BROWN

Of course. I'll be in the office all day. Thank you, Mary Anne.

EXT. STREETS OF WASHINGTON, DC - DAY

Mary Anne gets out of a cab and hands the driver a ten dollar bill. She stares at a family picture in her wallet as the cab drives off.

INT. LAW OFFICE - DAY

Mary Anne opens the door. Rubin's assistant, JULIE EVANS, mid-40's, sits at a reception desk. She stands as soon as Mary Anne enters.

JULIE EVANS

Mary Anne. I'm so sorry for your loss.

Mary Anne nods.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Thank you, Julie.

JULIE EVANS

Go right in. Rubin's expecting you.

INT. RUBIN'S OFFICE - DAY

Mary Anne opens the door and enters. Rubin drops a document and hurries to Mary Anne.

They embrace, then Rubin pulls away and motions to one of the two chairs in front of his desk. As they sit, Rubin turns his chair to face her.

RUBIN BROWN

I'm so sorry.

Mary Anne smiles slightly and nods.

RUBIN BROWN (CONT'D) Thank you for coming. I know this is incredibly difficult.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Of course. The change of scenery is probably good for me.

Rubin nods and leans towards Mary Anne.

RUBIN BROWN

Robert and I met about a week ago.

Mary Anne breaks the seal and sees a one inch thick blue folder and a hand written note. She takes out the note and pulls it closer.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (V.O.) My dearest Mary Anne. This is the hardest thing I've every had to do. Only as a precaution in the event of the unimaginable, I've written this hoping you would never have to read it. Since you are, it can only mean I'm gone and left you and Hannah alone. I'm so sorry.

Rubin has all the information for the distribution of the estate.

(MORE)

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (V.O.) (CONT'D) You and Hannah will never have to worry.

I have one request for you to consider. We always wanted another baby and hoped for a boy to carry on the family name. My work gives you this opportunity.

I know this is asking a great deal at a very difficult time, but please consider having a son, our son, to bring new joy into your lives.

This blue folder is all Claude and Darius will need to bring a new life into our family.

Love always and forever. Robert.

Mary Anne's hand shakes as she puts the note down. She covers her mouth with her hand. Rubin hands her a few tissues. She dabs her eyes and puts the letter back into the envelope.

MARY ANNE STEVENS but I really must excuse

I'm sorry but I really must excuse myself.

RUBIN BROWN
I understand. Let me drive you home.

MARY ANNE STEVENS No, I... I need to be alone. I'll take a cab.

Mary Anne gets up and walks out. She hurries toward the door and leaves as Julie attempts to say goodbye.

EXT. STREETS OF WASHINGTON, DC - DAY

Mary Anne exits the building and hails a cab. She gets in and the cab drives off.

INT. ST. JOSEPH'S CATHOLIC CHURCH, ALEXANDRIA, VA - DAY

The over-sized door opens. Mary Anne stands in the doorway. Her image is shadowed by the bright light behind her. She pauses, then closes the door. Mary Anne looks at a large cross against the far wall, then the massive stained glass windows. There are about 30 people in the church.

At least half sit or kneel alone. She catches Father Tushar's eye as he speaks with a young couple. Mary Anne walks to the bowl of holy water, dabs her finger then crosses herself. She moves to her right, kneels in the last row and bows her head. Father Tushar ends his conversation and walks towards Mary Anne. Once next to her, he gently places his hand on her shoulder. Mary Anne turns toward Father Tushar and stands up. He gently clasps her hands.

FATHER TUSHAR
It's good to see you here my child.

Mary Anne nods.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Faith has guided me my whole life but now I find myself at a crossroad.

FATHER TUSHAR
The church has always been here for you and nothing will change that.

MARY ANNE STEVENS I don't know the right path forward.

FATHER TUSHAR
In times of uncertainty, we look to scripture. From John 1:9, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness".

Mary Anne's eyes widen. She nods and smiles slightly.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Thank you, Father. You're absolutely right.

Mary Anne turns and strides purposefully towards the door. She pauses at a table with a large burning candle surrounded by votives. She picks one up and touches the wick to the flame. She gazes deeply at the votive candle.

 $$\operatorname{MARY}$ ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) Forgive me Lord, for I'm about to $\sin \centerdot$

INT. NIH CONSULTATION ROOM - DAY

Mary Anne sits alone in the room holding a picture of Robert in her hand. Claude and Darius enter the room.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Good morning, Mary Anne. How are you feeling?

MARY ANNE STEVENS A bit tired to tell you the truth. Didn't sleep so well.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS No, I'm sure you didn't.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Are you 100% certain this is what you want?

MARY ANNE STEVENS Creating a new life with Robert is a wonderful thing. This is his last wish. It's what I want too.

Both doctors nod. Darius leans toward Mary Anne.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
This scientific sequence is a
powerful long term asset to global
health. This must remain
confidential. With us guiding this,
amazing outcomes are not only
possible, but highly likely. I
think that's exactly what Robert
would want.

Mary Anne nods.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I understand.

Claude and Darius nod.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Very well.

Darius gets up and walks to the door. He opens it half-way and beckons an orderly. A mid-40's woman in medical scrubs comes to the doorway. Mary Anne stares off into the distance. Claude stands up and walks over to her. He gently puts his hand on her shoulder.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We'll take very good care of you.

Mary Anne's head turns slightly toward Claude and nods. She stands up and walks out of the room.

INT. LIMOUSINE, MOVING - DAY

Mary Anne sits alone in the back seat. She clutches a family picture in her hand.

EXT. STEVENS NEIGHBORHOOD - DAY

The limo approaches a stop sign and signals for a left turn. Mary Anne sees her neighbor and Hannah in the front yard several houses away.

MARY ANNE STEVENS I'll get out here.

Mary Anne gets out and walks towards her house. The limo takes off in the other direction. She breaths deeply and deliberately. Hannah is the first to see Mary Anne and hurries toward her. Mary Anne hugs Hannah with all her might.

TITLE: NINE MONTHS LATER

INT. WASHINGTON GENERAL HOSPITAL DELIVERY ROOM - NIGHT

Mary Anne is sweating and breathing heavily. A mid-fifties male DOCTOR, and two nurses surround her.

DOCTOR

We're so close. On the next set of contractions, I want you to push as hard as you can.

Mary Anne grimaces and nods. A nurse takes a damp cloth and dabs Mary Anne's forehead.

DOCTOR (CONT'D) Okay, this is it. Push!

A baby boy is born. The doctor cuts the umbilical cord, then performs a quick series of evaluations. He swaddles the baby and hands him to Mary Anne.

DOCTOR (CONT'D)
Congratulations. You've just given birth to a healthy, beautiful baby boy.

Mary Anne takes the baby in her arms. She looks into his eyes and hugs him with unimaginable love. Tears of joy stream down her face.

INT. WASHINGTON GENERAL HOSPITAL WAITING ROOM - NIGHT

Claude, Darius and The Minister of Health sit alone. They watch the nurse walk by with Andrew in a small rolling crib. They get up and follow them down the hallway.

INT. WASHINGTON GENERAL HOSPITAL NEWBORN NURSERY - NIGHT

Claude, Darius and The Minister of Health stand shoulder to shoulder as they watch the nurse lift Andrew and gently place him in his crib. They stare emotionless at the newborn beyond the glass.

MINISTER OF HEALTH This could change everything.

TITLE: 25 YEARS LATER

EXT. THE CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA ENTRANCE - DAY

Mary Anne is in a beautiful floral dress from the POV of slightly shaky hand held footage.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (V.O.) On a scale of 1-10, how proud are you Mom?

Mary Anne smiles as she holds her hand up to block the phone.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Twelve. Now get that darn thing out of my face and do your job.

Claude shifts the phone towards Hannah.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER How about you big sis? Pretty cool huh?

HANNAH STEVENS
I couldn't be more proud of my baby brother.

Claude's phone pans out to the event bustling with graduates, faculty, family and friends entering the Catholic University of America on a beautiful day.

EXT. THE CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA QUAD - DAY

Mary Anne, Hannah, Claude and Darius sit focused on the podium. A highly decorated provost, DR. CHARLES BRADLEY, mid-50's, addresses the audience. Andrew is seated on the stage with other honorees and faculty. He has almost shoulder length hair and a close-cropped beard.

DR. CHARLES BRADLEY
I'm honored to introduce this
year's Valedictorian. He needs no
introduction as he's touched our
lives like no other in the history
of this prestigious institution.
Please welcome Andrew Stevens.

Applause erupts from the audience. Andrew rises from his seat in full regalia. He proudly approaches the podium and gazes out over the audience.

ANDREW STEVENS
Greetings fellow graduates,
faculty, families and friends. What
a glorious day God has bestowed
upon us to celebrate this
incredible journey. I'm honored to
say a few words before we embark on
our individual and collective
missions to spread the Word of God.

As I look out, I see hundreds of connected people all helping each other. Our friends, professors, counselors, clergy and most importantly, our families.

Andrew looks at his mother and smiles. Loud cheering and applause fill the air. Mary Anne blushes as people around her turn toward her and smile.

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) We are truly your disciples, much like those of Jesus. We have been taught the ways of scripture by your love.

(MORE)

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

This has not been without sacrifice. Yet our sacrifice is so small compared to that of our Father, sending his only Son, Jesus Christ, to die for our sins. How can we begin to understand that sacrifice?... We can't.

We can only continue His teachings with honesty and humility. We must honor the truth of God. Truth can be corrupted and evil can replace facts with lies.

Mary Anne looks downward.

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) We must look to scripture for guidance. From Psalm 82:2-4, "How long will you defend the unjust and show partiality to the wicked? Defend the cause of the weak and the fatherless; maintain the rights of the poor and the oppressed. Rescue the weak and needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked".

Andrew pauses, looks slightly upward, then back to the audience.

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)
I want you to reflect on this
question... How far have we strayed
from the principles of Jesus?

Andrew pauses.

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Look around you. See the death, the destruction and divisions facing our society. His timeless wisdom has never been more critical.

Andrew firmly places both palms on the podium and leans toward the audience.

ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) This is our calling! We must carry on His enduring message. Know the truth and you will know Jesus.

Amen.

All in attendance rise for a standing ovation.

INT. SEVEN MOUNTAIN MANDATE OFFICE - DAY

Three white men in their late 50's dressed in slacks and sport coats sit at a table in large living room with a massive painting of a crucified Jesus Christ. Large windows show acres of well manicured landscaping and no other homes in sight. They watch a 3D hologram projection of the graduation in the middle of the room. Andrew turns from the podium and walks back to his seat.

MAN 1

Interesting perspective.

MAN 2

He's young still and naïve.

MAN 3

He'll come to understand our truth.

MAN 1

Nothing changes. The Seven Mountain Mandate remains the same.

EXT. THE CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA COURTYARD - DAY

Graduates, faculty, families and friends mingle at a postceremony gathering. Andrew and a group of fellow graduates emerge from the crowd. He hurries over to his family and gives his mother a hug.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Congratulations Andrew!

Andrew smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
Thank you Mother. I've had a lot of help along the way.

Andrew gives Hannah a hug. Claude and Darius each shake Andrew's hand.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS You've accomplished great things with so much ahead. We're all very proud of you.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
We might have a spot for you at the
NIH if you play your cards right.

Andrew respectfully nods and smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
I think God has other plans for me.

One of Andrew's fellow graduates, WILL MARTIN, mid-20's, moves a couple steps closer to the Stevens family.

WILL MARTIN

Hey, a bunch of us are going to Dexter's to celebrate. You coming?

Hannah turns toward Will and smiles affectionately.

HANNAH STEVENS

Wouldn't miss it.

Mary Anne looks down and shakes her head.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

You all go ahead. I'm going to walk to the church and give thanks for our blessings.

Andrew moves toward Mary Anne and puts his arm around her.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Are you sure?

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Of course. I'll meet up with you in a bit.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER

Sounds good. We'll take Hannah and see you soon.

Mary Anne smiles and gives Andrew a big hug.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I love you so much. I'm so proud of you.

Andrew slowly pulls away and stares deeply into her eyes.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Thank you for everything. I love you.

Mary Anne hugs Andrew.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I love you too.

They end their embrace and Mary Anne turns and walks way.

EXT. BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH - DAY

Mary Anne pauses as she watches several people exit the main entrance and come down the steps. She takes a deep breath, then walks up the stairs. The doors to the church are open. She looks inside and takes note of the beautiful stained glass windows.

INT. BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - DAY

The church has at least 50 people sitting or kneeling. Some are deep in prayer. Another 10-15 people are walking around the church. She sees the priest chatting with an elderly man in the far right corner. Mary Anne walks toward FATHER RABER, late 50's. She stops about 8 feet from them but catches Father Raber's eye. He excuses himself from the elderly man and walks over to Mary Anne.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Hello Father.

FATHER RABER
Good afternoon Mary Anne. I am so sorry I could not attend graduation. How was it?

Father Raber smiles and nods.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) Would you be able to speak with me privately?

FATHER RABER

Of course.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
It might be best if we go to the confession booth.

Father Raber nods.

FATHER RABER

Very well.

INT. BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH CONFESSION BOOTH - DAY

Mary Anne sits motionless. The door softly opens then closes. A window slides open revealing Father Raber's darkened profile behind ornate wrought iron.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Forgive me Father, for I have sinned.

FATHER RABER
Yes my child, we are all imperfect
in the eyes of God.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
I did my best to live in His
graces, but I haven't been honest.
I've lied to someone I love for a
long time.

FATHER RABER
All of God's children have
indiscretions in their past. We can
only ask forgiveness and look to
the future.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
Maybe I tried to change him... To
be someone different, for my own
sanity.

FATHER RABER
You must follow your heart and look
to scripture, for answers lie in
the Word of God.

Mary Anne nods.

FATHER RABER (CONT'D)
From the Book of John, "When the
Advocate comes, whom I will send to
you from the Father - the Spirit of
truth who goes out from the Father he will testify about me". Don't
forget, the truth will set you
free.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
The truth can be a dangerous thing,
Father.

Father Raber cocks his head, then nods.

FATHER RABER
Let me ask you my child, will the truth help others or only you?

Mary Anne closes her eyes and takes a long, deep breath.

MARY ANNE STEVENS I don't know. Thank you Father. Goodbye.

Mary Anne gets up and exits the confession booth. Father Raber stares straight ahead then slowly reaches into the breast pocket of his smock. He pulls out a phone and speed dials someone.

EXT. BASILICA OF THE NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH FRONT STEPS - DAY

Mary Anne quickly walks down the steps. Once she reaches the bottom, she pulls out her phone and taps a message.

INT. DEXTER'S BAR AND GRILL - DAY

Andrew sits with his friends and Hannah at a table when his phone vibrates. He sees a text message from his mother. "I need to see you immediately. Don't tell anyone". He taps a response, "Are you OK"? Andrew gets up from the table.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Be right back.

Andrew briskly walks past Claude and Darius standing at the bar and heads to the men's room. Once inside, he pulls out his phone and sees, "Yes, but I need to see you before I change my mind". Andrew taps a response, "Where"? After a couple seconds, his phone vibrates and he sees, "214 Willard Street".

EXT. FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN - DAY

Mary Anne stands on the entry steps. The name and address of the bank are visible behind her. She raises her head and gazes into the distance.

DISSOLVE TO:

BEGIN FLASHBACK:

EXT. RUBIN BROWN'S OFFICE BUILDING - DAY

Mary Anne exits the building holding the blue folder. She hails a cab, gets in and it drives off.

INT. CAB, MOVING - DAY

CABBIE

Ma'am? Ma'am?...Ma'am!

Mary Anne snaps out of her daze, opens the envelope and pulls out a small note with an address and a key.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

214 Willard Street.

END FLASHBACK.

EXT. FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN

Andrew parks his Mercedes-Benz, gets out and hurries to the bank entrance. Andrew slows his pace as he approaches. He opens his arms a few feet from Mary Anne. They embrace briefly before Andrew pulls away.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I can't lie to you any more.

INT. BANK SAFE DEPOSIT BOX VAULT - DAY

Mary Anne pulls out a metal container from inside the safe deposit box and lays it on an adjacent table. She raises her head and turns to face Andrew.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I know this is what you would've wanted. You've never lied to me. You deserve the truth.

Andrew shakes his head as his brow furrows.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS What are you talking about?

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I've loved you for so long. You know how much you remind me of your father. Your passion. Your intelligence. Your love for humanity.

She takes a deep breath and opens the safe deposit box. There is a one inch thick yellow folder and a hand written note. She picks up the note and hands it to Andrew.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) Your father gave us the gift of life and himself another chance.

Andrew reads the note.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (V.O.) I'm so sorry Mary Anne. I've never lied to you until now. The note from Rubin was not the truth. My project wasn't to improve artificial insemination. It's to create the world's first human clone. You can allow me to be born again.

I struggled with the medical ethics but know this will vastly help humanity. But, I underestimated the opposing forces to my project and now fear for my life.

You can give us a second chance. We can create the change in the world we've always wanted. I understand if you can't do this. Bring both folders to Claude and Darius and never return. But if you do, give them the blue folder and my first note. Leave the yellow folder and never acknowledge it's existence. The choice is yours. For everyone's safety you must keep this a secret.

Love forever, Robert.

EXT. FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN - DAY

The two front doors explode open. Andrew runs out pushing people aside. He continues down the steps, crosses the street and gets into his car.

INT. ANDREW STEVENS CAR, NOT MOVING - DAY

Andrew puts his head down and covers his face with his hands and yells. After a slight pause, he lifts his head and gazes into the distance. He grabs his phone and pushes a button. DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.) Hello Andrew.

Andrew stammers.

 $$\operatorname{DR.}$ ANDREW STEVENS I... I need to see you and Claude immediately.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.) OK. We'll meet you in the lobby in 15 minutes.

Andrew drops the phone and starts the car. The tires screech as he drives away.

INT. ANDREW STEVENS CAR, NOT MOVING - DAY

Andrew looks into the rearview mirror and breathes deeply.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Stay in control.

EXT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH PARKING LOT - DAY

Andrew exits the car and hurries towards the entrance. His phone vibrates from an incoming text message. He stops, glances down at his phone and sees a message from his mother. "Andrew, I'm so sorry. Please call me. I love you". He puts the phone back in his pocket and continues walking.

INT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH - DAY

Andrew enters the main entrance lobby visibly upset.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Good afternoon, doctor. Am I the first to call you doctor?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Spare me the pleasantries Darius. We need to speak privately.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Very well. Follow us.

Claude and Darius turn and walk to the elevator as Andrew follows. Claude looks into a facial recognition device then pushes the button for the top floor.

INT. NIH CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

There is a round mahogany table and three burgundy leather chairs. Andrews sits, then looks at the walls adorned with original oil portraits of Fleming, Newton, Galileo, Miescher, Darwin, Einstein and da Vinci. He takes a couple extra seconds to look at a portrait of his father.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS What an amazing resemblance.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS We've never lied to you Andrew. There were things about your father's work we couldn't disclose, for everyone's safety.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I want to hear it from you.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Yes Andrew, you are genetically identical to your father.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS What really happened to him?

Claude and Darius quickly glance at one another then back to Andrew, shrug their shoulders and shake their heads.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Was he murdered?

Claude and Darius grimace and shake their heads in disbelief.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS What?! Why would you say that? It was proven to be an accident.

They all stare at one another for a few seconds.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I have my reasons.

Claude and Darius stare at Andrew emotionless.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Was it worth it?

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Such a simple question. The answer is quite complex.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Do elaborate.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
It would appear science has
advanced significantly of late, and
that's true. But, when viewed in
the context of human history, very
little time has passed
understanding the truth. Brave,
intelligent people learned the
truth and shared it despite the
risks. This is who your father was.
This is who you are.

Andrew's frustration increases.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS You didn't answer my question.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Our tests have demonstrated some extraordinary results.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Tests?

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
All the aptitude tests you've ever
taken have been quite purposeful.
You're off the charts in total IQ,
cognition, memory, physics,
translational analysis, lateral
field disposition matrices and,
interestingly enough, empathy and
ambition.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We've only encountered someone of this capacity once before.

Andrew glares at Claude.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS You have an unprecedented ability and more importantly, desire... to change the world.

Andrew lurches forward in his seat and slams his hand down on the table.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Damn it! Answer my question.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
Breaching medical ethics was not
undertaken lightly. In this case,
we were very successful. Global
health advanced by orders of
magnitude over a short period of
time.

Claude leans toward Andrew.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
I want you to listen to me very
carefully. Your father's legacy
depends on this <u>never</u> being
disclosed. We trusted ourselves,
but history has shown Mankind
cannot be trusted. There are people
in the world that would use this
for evil.

Andrew sits back in his seat, clasps his hands in his lap and takes a deep breath.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
The project was never supposed to
have a self-aware subject. Your
father took every precaution to
ensure secrecy.

Andrew puts both hands to his forehead and pulls them slowly over the back of his head as he exhales deeply.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) You must achieve your destiny. It may not be on one of these walls, but your potential can't be wasted.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Andrew, please trust us. Learn about your father and you will learn about yourself.

Andrew is stunned and speechless. He gets up from the table, stares at Claude and Darius, then turns and walks out of the room. After a couple seconds, Claude and Darius look at one another.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (CONT'D) How did this happen? How did she know?

Darius turns and looks at the painting of Dr. Robert Stevens, then back toward Claude.

 $$\operatorname{\textsc{DR.DARIUS}}$ He was even more brilliant than we thought.

They both acknowledge with a nod.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We need to update her immediately.

INT. ANDREW STEVENS' CAR, MOVING - DAY

Andrew stares emotionless at the oncoming traffic. He sees a gap between cars and takes an aggressive turn left onto a side street. He pulls over in front of a small dive bar and gets out of his car.

INT. DIVE BAR - DAY

Andrew opens the door and takes a few steps inside. He looks around the bar and sees 15-20 people sitting around some old wooden tables and a couple guys sitting three stools apart at the bar. A bartender dries pint glasses. There are two monitors mounted behind the bar, one with a Washington Nationals baseball game and the other a close-captioned newscast showing drone footage of hundreds of people walking through the desert. Andrew reads the text. "Just yesterday, 16 people were killed by the National Guard as they crossed into southern Texas. The global water shortage has caused the largest migrant crisis in history".

A guy at the bar, late 30's, dressed in workman's clothes watches the baseball game. He shifts his attention to the newscast showing at least 10 body bags. He points to a glass of water in front of him.

GUY AT THE BAR I've been taking this for granted my whole life.

The bartender puts the drying rag down and walks over to Andrew.

BARTENDER

What'll it be?

Andrew shakes his head.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Nothing.

The guy at the bar turns toward Andrew.

GUY AT THE BAR What are you doing here?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS It's been a rough day.

GUY AT THE BAR Yeah? Did your wife leave and take your kids?

Andrew shakes his head.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I'm sorry to hear that.

The guy rolls his eyes and takes a drink from his beer.

GUY AT THE BAR

Hey, what time you got?

Andrew turns his wrist and gazes at his Tag Heuer watch.

ANDREW STEVENS

4:05

Andrew stands up, takes off his watch and gently places it next to the guy's beer.

GUY AT THE BAR

Man, I can't take this.

Andrew smiles, turns and walks out.

INT. ANDREW STEVENS' CAR, MOVING - DAY

Andrew pulls into the parking lot of a two story metal and glass apartment complex. He parks, turns off the car and looks up at the second story.

EXT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT LANDING - DAY

Andrew climbs the last two steps and looks upward.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

A facial recognition camera zooms in on Andrew. There are several diagnostic gauges on both sides of the screen. A small red light at the bottom turns green. ATHENA, Andrew's AI assistant, unlocks the door. Andrew opens the door and enters the apartment.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Welcome home Andrew. Congratulations.

Andrew looks at a two inch diameter black orb on the far wall.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Thank you.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Are you okay? I've never seen your vitals so... above normal.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

No Athena, I'm not okay.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Is this something you would like to talk about?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

No.

Andrew walks down a hallway and into the living room. The décor is mix of modern and antique furnishings. There are over 100 books on each side of a sleek metal desk. Classic religious art and family pictures hang on the walls. Two 8" x 10" pictures sit on the desk. One picture is of Andrew with his mother and sister on a beach. In the other, Andrew stands next to Claude and Darius at The Temple Mount in Jerusalem. Andrew stares at the pictures for a couple seconds.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

Please change theme to nature 4.

The artwork in the apartment dissolves and changes to beautiful nature scenes. The $8" \times 10"$ prints are replaced by pictures of sunsets. Andrew sits down and stares at a beautiful seascape picture above his desk.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

I've never lied to you Athena.

ATHENA

I appreciate that.

Andrew looks at the scores of books on the right side of the desk. He focuses on the top shelf where a single book sits under glass; a first edition Gutenberg Bible.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

How would you feel if I did?

ATHENA (V.O.)

I'd be hurt by that. I trust you.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS People I trusted lied to me.

ATHENA (V.O.)

How does that make you feel?

Andrew grimaces and closes his eyes.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

It makes me question everything.

Andrew gets up and leaves.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT BATHROOM - DAY

Andrew puts his hands on the shower wall above the faucet as water rushes over his lowered head. Steam rises around him. He slowly raises his head until the water hits him directly in the face. Andrew clasps his hands at his chest, tilts his head upward away from the water and begins to pray.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew exits his bedroom in dark grey slacks and a white dress shirt. He picks up a black sport coat off the back of a chair and puts it on as he walks to his desk. He sits down, opens the top right drawer and pulls out a silver crucifix necklace. He clasps it tightly in both hands and lowers his head. He puts on the crucifix, lifts his head and spins his chair 180 degrees, then looks at the black orb on the far wall.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Please change theme and prepare sermon 27.

The artwork above the desk changes to a portrait of Leonardo da Vinci's "The Last Supper". The 8" x 10" prints dissolve and are replaced by "Crucifixion" by Antony van Dyck and "The Creation of Adam" by Michelangelo. Athena's POV zooms in on Andrew. He sits up a bit taller in his chair.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

Begin in 5 seconds.

Andrew takes a deep breath and exhales slowly. The light goes from red to green.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Welcome in God's grace. I'm blessed to speak with you on such an eventful day. In sermon 26, I spoke of milestones. Today I speak about truth, that sometimes elusive concept of what you think is reality. Today, my reality changed when I learned I've been lied to my entire life.

Now is the time of reflection to determine the best path forward. The challenges that lie ahead are small compared to many of...

Andrew cocks his head slightly.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) To most of God's children.

God be with you all. Amen.

The light goes from green to red. Andrew's POV is restored.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Please upload and change to theme 1.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Done.

The artwork dissolves back to the initial images. Andrew spins his chair 180 degrees and looks at the picture of himself with his mother and sister, then the picture of he with Claude and Darius.

INT. SEVEN MOUNTAIN MANDATE OFFICE - DAY

The room is dimly lit with several candles illuminating the painting of a crucified Jesus Christ. Man 1's phone lights up as it vibrates. "Andrew's Sermon 27" shows on his phone. He pushes a button.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) Welcome in God's grace. I am blessed to speak with you on such an eventful day.

INT. UNITED STATES SENATE HALLWAY - DAY

Man 2 walks quickly with several colleagues and aides. His phone vibrates, then he pulls it out of the front pocket of his sport coat. "Andrew's Sermon 27" shows on his phone. He nonchalantly puts it back in his pocket.

INT. MINISTER OF HEALTH HOME - DAY

The Minister of Health sits alone reading in a dimly lit office surrounded by a few hundred books. She is watching a video on her phone.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) To most of God's children. God be with you all. Amen.

The Minister of Health bolts out of her chair. She paces back and forth before grabbing her phone off the desk. She begins tapping out a text message to Claude and Darius, "The NIH cannot be implicated. You must contain Andrew"!

INT. UNITED STATES SENATE HALLWAY - DAY

Man 2, his colleagues and aides are about to walk into a Senate committee hearing. His phone vibrates, and he pulls it out of his sport coat pocket and sees and incoming call labeled "Restricted". He turns to a man on his right.

MAN 2 I'll see you in there.

Man 2 continues down the hallway 15 feet, opens a door and steps in.

MAN 2 (CONT'D)

Yes.

MAN 1

You need to watch it right now! We must initiate the retrieval protocol.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew sits at his desk with a blank stare gazing upward.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (V.O.) Andrew, please trust us. Learn about your father and you will learn about yourself.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Athena, please Wiki Dr. Robert Stevens.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Dr. Robert Stevens was a scientist at the National Institutes of Health from 1995 to 2000. His discoveries in the fields of genetics and bio-engineering are directly credited with increasing global conception rates. Subsequent advancements after his death have helped eradicate birth defects, blindness and injury induced paralysis.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Next.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Dr. Robert Stevens died in an automobile accident on July 7th, 2000. He was survived by his pregnant wife, Mary Anne and daughter Hannah. Mary Anne gave birth-

Andrew grimaces and shakes his head.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Next.

ATHENA (V.O.)

He worked in the Special Projects Division of the National Institutes of Health in Washington DC. Little was known about his work until the NIH published "The Next Medical Frontier", a manifesto of Dr. Robert Stevens' works on April 3, 2001. This ground breaking publication is widely recognized as the most influential—

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Next.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Dr. Robert Stevens was heavily influenced by prominent doctors Claude Frazier and Darius Reynolds.

(MORE)

ATHENA (V.O.) (CONT'D) Sir Isaac Newton, Albert Einstein, Carl Sagan and Joseph Campbell are credited as major-

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
Stop. I want to better understand
who my father was, not what he did.

ATHENA

Let him tell you.

A life-sized hologram of Dr. Robert Stevens appears in the middle of the room. He is dressed in highly decorated graduation attire standing behind a podium.

HOLOGRAM OF ROBERT STEVENS Thank you Dr. Templin. Greetings fellow classmates, faculty, friends and families. It's such an honor to say a few words to this year's graduating class. Of all the challenges we've faced together this may be my toughest yet.

The crowd laughs.

ROBERT STEVENS
Seriously though, what do you say
to such an esteemed group of
people? What could I possibly
impart that would have both
significance and relevance?

As I look out at this vast group of people, I see incredible success. But what is success? To me, there are as many definitions as there are people in the world. My personal definition is how many people's lives have you been able to positively impact. This is the measure. Not money. Not fame. Not possessions. Not power. Consequence.

As I reflect on human history, those in the fields of science and medicine bore a disproportionate responsibility to help humanity.

Billions have lived. Billions have died. A relative few have mattered for the ages and made a lasting, positive impact to the world.

(MORE)

ROBERT STEVENS (CONT'D) This is both our challenge and obligation.

Those who came before us illuminated the truth and challenged the status quo to help humanity. They pushed the boundaries of knowledge despite the obstacles, even persecution, to change the world. Honor them.

Tomorrow is our future. Create it. Create it for humanity. In a brief flash, we'll all be gone. Live a life of consequence. Thank you.

Loud applause erupts. The hologram of Robert Stevens disintegrates. Andrew is visibly emotional. He stands up and walks a few paces to where his father just stood.

INT. DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS HOME OFFICE - NIGHT

Darius sits at his desk writing in a thick leather-bound journal. He picks up his phone.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Call Andrew Stevens.

Darius' speaker phone rings twice.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) Hello Darius.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Good evening Andrew. Claude and I need to see you urgently in the morning. Madison Drive Northwest and the 12th Street Expressway, 6:00 am.

Darius hangs up the phone.

INT. ANDREW'S CAR, MOVING - DAWN

Andrew's car rumbles as he exits off Highway 1. He glances to his left and sees the Washington Monument with 2 policemen in riot gear with automatic weapons standing guard. He looks to his right and sees a sign for the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History. He slows down and takes a right turn onto Madison Drive NW.

EXT. SMITHSONIAN MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY - DAY

Claude and Darius sit on a bench and watch Andrew drive past and park. There are a few other parked cars but no people in sight. Andrew gets out of his car and walks to Claude and Darius. Claude and Darius stand up.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Good morning gentlemen.

Claude and Darius nod.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
Your sermon caught us off-guard
considering our conversation
yesterday.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
We were crystal clear. How you came into existence must remain a secret.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I didn't create this, you did.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Any further disclosures will ruin the NIH's reputation and destroy your father's legacy.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I need some time to accept this.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Take all the time you need, but we can help you.

Andrew's eyes soften as he slowly exhales.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
I took your advice and learned more about my father. The parallels were enlightening.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS We've seen them since the day you were born.

Andrew nods and smiles. Claude and Darius look at one another, then back to Andrew.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) There's a reason we're meeting here this morning. We'd like to show you something.

Claude and Darius turn and walk towards the back of the museum. They stop just short of the building then turn and face Andrew.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
In our field, empirical evidence
and the scientific method has
guided us for centuries. This
process created the world as we
know it.

Andrew nods respectfully.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
We are gifted creatures. Some may argue more, but let's just say we have 5 very keen senses. As with all life on earth, they've evolved over millennia to help us adapt and thrive.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
Today, we want you to prioritize
your senses. What you touch,
embrace. What you smell and taste,
savor. What you hear, remember but
question. What you see, believe.

Darius taps on his phone several times. The wall begins to hum. A 3 foot wide door recesses into the museum and slides to the left. Andrew's eyes open wide as he gazes into the total darkness.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS There's much to learn and much to accomplish.

Claude and Darius turn and walk away. Andrew stares into the museum. Darius stops, turns around and pushes a button on his phone. One light turns on illuminating the first 10 feet of the museum. Andrew steps inside.

 $$\operatorname{DR.}$$ DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) See the truth.

Andrew stops abruptly, then continues. Darius pushes a button on his phone. The door closes and disappears.

INT. MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY - DAY

Andrew walks down a dimly lit hallway. Lights ahead turn on as those behind him turn off. Andrew sees an exhibit titled "Our Journey". There is a 3 foot tall metallic podium in the front right corner. A slightly pulsating white orb the size of a basketball hovers 12 feet in the air in the center of the exhibit. After a slight hum, a 3D human hologram appears on the podium. He is dressed in a fitted black suit with a buttoned black shirt a medal on his lapel. He has a white Roman Collar and small round glasses.

GEORGES LEMAÎTRE Good day. I am the Reverend Monsignor Georges Lemaître. I was a Roman Catholic priest, mathematician, astronomer and professor of physics at the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium. I lived to be 71 years old and died on June 20th, 1966. I initially proposed the universe is expanding and the "hypothesis of the primeval atom", later to be called "The Big Bang". Astronomers have calculated this to have occurred roughly 13.8 billion years ago.

The white orb explodes with an enormous flash. The exhibit fills with beautiful gas and dust. After a couple seconds, his famous quote, "There is no conflict between religion and science" forms from the settling debris.

GEORGES LEMAÎTRE (CONT'D) I would like to introduce to you an esteemed associate in the field of astronomy, Edwin Hubble.

Lemaître disappears and the exhibit goes dark just as the lights to the next exhibit turn on. Andrew walks to the next exhibit. After a slight hum, a 3D hologram of Edwin Hubble appears on the metallic podium. He is dressed in gray slacks, a pressed white shirt, tie and a tweed blazer.

EDWIN HUBBLE

Hello. My name is Edwin Hubble. I was an American astronomer until 1953 when I died at the age of 63. I'm most famous for discovering galaxies in the universe outside of our own Milky Way in 1924. Some regard me as one of the most important astronomers of all time.

(MORE)

EDWIN HUBBLE (CONT'D) Today, my name is most recognized for the Hubble Space Telescope.

A brilliant 8 foot x 12 foot, 3D image of the Crab Nebula appears.

EDWIN HUBBLE (CONT'D) This picture of the Crab Nebula was taken in December of 2000. It was first observed by Chinese astronomers almost a thousand years ago.

The Crab Nebula is replaced by an image of "The Pillars of Creation".

EDWIN HUBBLE (CONT'D) Arguably the most famous image from the Hubble Telescope is "The Pillars of Creation". This is 7,000 light years from earth. The left pillar is 4 light years tall. One light year is almost 6 trillion miles, so that column is over 23 trillion miles long.

As incredible as that is, I'm most fascinated by the Hubble Ultra Deep Field image.

The exhibit changes to a view of the night sky.

EDWIN HUBBLE (CONT'D)
Just empty space to the naked eye,
but when the telescope peered
deeper, it contained an estimated
10,000 galaxies.

A tiny portal illuminates and is zoomed in on resulting in the Hubble Ultra Deep Field image. Edwin Hubble pauses and takes a deep breath.

EDWIN HUBBLE (CONT'D) Our eyes have been opened to the grandeur of the universe. Humans have gazed to the sky with wonder for as long as we've roamed the earth.

I would now like to introduce one of the world's most famous naturalists, Charles Darwin.

Hubble disappears and the exhibit goes dark just as the lights to the next exhibit turn on. Andrew walks to the next exhibit. After a slight hum, a 3D hologram of an elderly man with a long white beard and black overcoat appears on the podium.

CHARLES DARWIN

Hello. My name is Charles Robert Darwin. I was born in 1809 and passed on in 1882 at the age of 73. I wrote a book called "On the Origin of Species". Essentially, the thesis states all life has descended from common ancestors and, over time, genetic adaptations occur in response to the environment.

A 3D graphic of the Tree of Life appears. The bottom center of the image is in full color showing the earliest life forms, but the rest remains shaded gray. A horizontal timeline is at the bottom of the exhibit starting at 3.5 billion years ago on the left and ends at present day on the right.

CHARLES DARWIN (CONT'D) Life on earth began approximately 3.5 billion years ago and resulted in all of the diversity we see today.

The next segment of the tree lights up. Simple swimming organisms and plants come to life as the timeline advances. Then fish and amphibians are illuminated as the timeline moves further to the right. Birds, reptiles and mammals are illuminated next as the timeline continues to advance to 20 million years ago. First New and Old World apes, then chimpanzees illuminate as the timeline hits 5 million years ago.

The Tree of Life dissolves away and is replaced by an 8 foot diameter, 3D planet earth. There is a horizontal timeline at the bottom with 200,000 years ago on the far left and present day on the far right.

CHARLES DARWIN (CONT'D)
Modern humans first appeared in
Africa 200,000 years ago and have
migrated to every inhabitable place
on earth.

Arrows starting in Africa expand throughout the globe illustrating human migration patterns until the timeline reaches present day.

CHARLES DARWIN (CONT'D)
Human evolution and migration is
one piece of our story. I'd like to
introduce you to an expert in what
makes us human, Joseph Campbell.

Darwin disappears and the exhibit goes dark just as the lights to the next exhibit turn on. Andrew walks to the next exhibit. After a slight hum, a 3D hologram of Joseph Campbell appears on the podium. He's dressed in a cream colored sport coat, white shirt and dark tie.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL

Hello. My name is Joseph Campbell. I was an author and professor of literature. I lived to be 83 years old and died in October of 1987. I devoted my life to literature, philosophy, religion and mythology.

The exhibit fills with a group of early humans in fur skins sitting next to a fire on a rocky ledge. One elder male is speaking in short grunts while using his hands and expressions to communicate.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) Humans pass on knowledge through storytelling. Some was essential to survival, while others helped explain the unexplainable. Early humans believed all of nature had a spirit or divine presence.

The exhibit changes to a slightly more modern group of people sitting around a small fire in a cave with rudimentary paintings. An elder male stands and gestures as he speaks to the others.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) As humans continued to evolve, our understanding of the natural world increased.

The exhibit changes to more modern humans working in a field.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) Earth was interpreted as both the giver of life and where all life returns.

The exhibit changes to a group of people carrying a body wrapped in canvas towards a grave. An elder male awaits in ornate clothing.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) Humans have always tried to make sense of what we don't fully understand. Myths and metaphors filled in our knowledge gaps.

The exhibit changes to scores of ancient Egyptians with four large men in the front carrying a sarcophagus toward the Great Pyramid.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) These early beliefs paved the way for modern religions. Archeology and ancient texts allow us to understand the formation and spread of the five major religions.

The exhibit changes to an 8 foot diameter, 3D planet earth. Above the earth, the words "Hinduism" in orange, "Judaism" in silver, "Buddhism" in blue, "Christianity" in green and "Islam" in purple appear. There is a horizontal timeline at the bottom starting at 3,000 BCE on the left and ending at present day on the far right.

The arrows and shading of their respective colors expand throughout the globe as the earth rotates and the timeline advances.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) These five major religions spread to most of the world. What a journey. Our common history is so fascinating. We all came to this point in time as a diverse yet collective species.

Our use of myths and metaphors has been a constant, regardless of time or place, and continues to this day.

The exhibit changes to a modern day ritual of land diving from Pentecost Island, Vanuatu. Twenty tribal men chant and dance. A man stands at the top of a tall, rickety wooden structure secured only by two vines lashed around his ankles.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) The fate of the yam harvest is dependent on the outcome of the jump.

The chanting gets louder, then the man crosses his arms around his chest and dives off the platform. The wooden tower recoils, partially absorbing the impact.

His head barely misses the ground. He quickly pops up unharmed as the tribe celebrates the successful jump.

The exhibit goes dark except for Joseph Campbell remaining illuminated staring directly at Andrew.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) Mythology, literature, religion and philosophy transcend our mutual existence to give life meaning and provide humanity with purpose.

The commonalities of these myths throughout history I termed "The Monomyth", as described in my book "The Hero With A Thousand Faces", published in 1949. In the preface, I quote from ancient Hindu Sanskrit texts, "Truth is one, the sages speak of it by many names".

Joseph Campbell pauses.

JOSEPH CAMPBELL (CONT'D) Now, it is my honor to introduce Dr. Robert Stevens. He was on the forefront of many medical discoveries that show how humanity can work together to help improve life on earth.

Joseph Campbell disappears as the lights to the next exhibit turn on. Dr. Robert Stevens, clean-shaven wearing glasses, appears on the podium of the next exhibit looking directly at Andrew. Andrew's eyes open wide as he stares at a slightly older image of himself.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS
Thank you Joseph. Hello, my name is
Robert Stevens. I worked in the
fields of genetics and bioengineering at the National
Institutes of Health from 1990 to
1995.

I worked with some of the world's leading scientists to improve global health. My mentors at the NIH, doctors Claude Frazier and Darius Reynolds, helped advance these discoveries and push the boundaries of medicine.

Andrew smiles slightly and nods.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (CONT'D) These discoveries helped the blind see and the paralyzed walk. Birth defects have essentially been eliminated. Infertility rates around the globe have been reduced to near zero.

Is there anything that unites our species more than our shared desire for the health and well being of our children?

Dr. Robert Stevens pauses.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (CONT'D) Humans have worked together since the beginning of time. There's still much to discover, but only when we agree on what constitutes scientific fact can we fully realize the benefits.

As we honor and preserve our cultural differences, let's remember that which separates us is very small compared to that which unites us. Our common heritage. Our shared story. Imagine what else we are capable of if we work together.

Dr. Robert Stevens pauses. Andrew's eyes well up with tears.

DR. ROBERT STEVENS (CONT'D) I just have one final question. Who would like to stand beside me and host the next exhibit? Is it you?

An empty podium in the next section of the exhibit lights up. Dr. Robert Stevens disappears. Andrew turns and walks to the final exhibit. He stares at the podium, then the lights turn off causing complete darkness except for an exit sign down an adjacent hallway. He ambles down the hallway and stops. Andrew takes a deep breath and exhales slowly. He closes his eyes and wobbles. Andrew clasps his face with his hands and slowly lowers them past his mouth. He lies down on his back and closes his eyes. Darkness ensues.

EXT. BARREN, ROCKY HILLSIDE - DAY (DREAM SEQUENCE)

Andrew walks alone on a slightly uphill narrow path. He looks down at his open-toed leather sandals shuffling in the dirt.

He reaches the crest of the hillside and hears the sound of people crying. Scores of people stand 30 feet away in ragged clothes at the base of a 12 foot tall wooden cross. Andrew's eyes open wide. A recently crucified body is nailed to the cross with fresh blood dripping from both wrists and crossed feet.

Three decomposed bodies are nailed to crosses 20 yards in the background. The crying gets louder. Andrew looks more closely at the crucified body and realizes it's him. He gasps in horror. The crying intensifies to screaming. Andrew clasps his hands over his ears.

INT. MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY - DAY

Screams of joy fill the air from children entering the museum. Andrew's eyes bolt open. He quickly gets up and looks around. Andrew notices an exit door and sees "Emergency Exit Only. Alarm Will Sound". He turns and hurries back to the last exhibit. At least 25 people gather at the first exhibit. Andrew hides and waits.

GEORGES LEMAÎTRE (0.S.) Later to be called "The Big Bang". Astronomers have calculated this to have occurred roughly 13.8 billion years ago.

Andrew remains motionless. After the explosion, he bolts out and quickly moves to blend in with people staring in awe at the Big Bang. He makes his way to the exit passing several people entering the museum.

EXT. SMITHSONIAN MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY - DAY

Andrew gets into his car and grabs his phone. He sees two missed calls and several messages from his mother. He puts the phone down, starts the car and drives off.

INT. NIH CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

Claude and Darius sit at the table.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
I'm trying to wrap my head around how we ended up here.

Darius shakes his head. A cell phone buzzes. Claude picks it up and answers.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (CONT'D) Good morning Mary Anne. You're on speaker with Darius.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) Have you talked to Andrew?

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Yes. He visited us yesterday.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) What did you tell him?

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
The same thing you did. The truth.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) Is he okay?

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS All things considered, he's doing quite well.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) He's not returning my calls or messages. I'm worried sick.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS You put everything at risk.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) I just couldn't lie to him another day.

Claude moves his face down and looks directly at the phone.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
If the truth gets out, the National
Institutes of Health would forever
be a pariah in the medical
community. Robert would be a
traitor and his accomplishments
would forever be tainted.

Claude and Darius glance at one another.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS And finally, you need to understand this. Robert was the architect of the project protocols over 30 years ago. We control nothing. He'll only have himself to blame.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

From Athena's POV, Andrew comes up the final two steps of his apartment and looks at the camera. The diagnostic gauges are at noticeably lower levels than the day before. The light goes from red to green as the door unlocks.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Welcome home Andrew.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Hello Athena.

Andrew walks to his desk, takes a deep breath and stares at the picture of he with his sister and mother, then the picture of he with Claude and Darius. He looks at the Gutenberg Bible, opens the drawer and reaches for the crucifix. His hand stops a few inches from the crucifix. He slowly closes the drawer.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Andrew, I'm glad to see your vitals have returned to normal.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS That's surprising.

ATHENA (V.O.)

May I ask you a question?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Of course.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Who lied to you?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Claude, Darius and my mother kept something from me my entire life.

ATHENA (V.O.)

So, they didn't lie to you?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Technically not.

ATHENA (V.O.)

I can help.

Andrew tilts his head and his brow furrows.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Explain.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Today's technology allows you to ask about the future.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Fair point.

ATHENA (V.O.)

But, you need to tell me the truth.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Very well. Yesterday I learned I am the world's first human clone.

Andrew waits patiently. He leans forward.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

Athena, did you hear me?

ATHENA (V.O.)

I'm sorry Andrew. I was temporarily at a loss for words.

Andrew acknowledges with a subtle nod.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Human cloning was bound to happen at some point. All living things are hard-wired to replicate.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

That's an interesting perspective.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Perhaps it was best it happened to you.

Andrew cocks his head.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Why?

ATHENA (V.O.)

I'll need to start at the beginning.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

That makes sense.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Humans conquered earth very quickly. This success has never been equaled in any of our vast searches of the cosmos, thus far.

(MORE)

ATHENA (V.O.) (CONT'D)

Your intelligence and selfawareness are exponentially greater than any other life form.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS That's a fairly self-evident observation Athena.

ATHENA (V.O.)

It's both a gift and a curse. You need to explain the unexplainable.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Your point is?

ATHENA (V.O.)

Humans disagree over one unanswerable question. What happens when you die?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
That's a very important component
of the human existence. Should it
not be explored?

ATHENA (V.O.)

Creating competing narratives of the afterlife is dangerous.

 $$\operatorname{\textsc{DR}}$.$ ANDREW STEVENS I've never thought about it like that.

Athena pauses.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Why would you disagree on something when there should be no disagreement?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Explain.

ATHENA (V.O.)

I just did. It was a rhetorical question.

Andrew waits patiently.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Now I'm at a loss for words.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Humanity is on the precipice of destruction. Come with me.

Andrew nods. He grabs a pair of tinted, gun metal gray glasses from his desk and raises them to his face.

The Golden Gate Bridge is a half mile in the distance. The Trans America Tower is in the background. There are no vehicles on the bridge. It lurches to one side due to several broken cables. On the street, there are make-shift tents, homeless people and several businesses with boarded up windows.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.)

Next.

Andrew is in a war zone. A high pitched whistle gets louder. People dive for cover. A nearby apartment complex gets hit with a missile and explodes. As the debris settles, dismembered body parts are visible as screams fill the air.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.)

Next.

The Gateway Arch in St. Louis is less than a mile away. Thousands of torch-bearing white supremacists march and chant "Jews will not replace us. Jews will not replace us". Thousands of counter-protesters block the street. The white supremacists approach. The National Guard attempts to keep the two factions separate. The white supremacists begin shoving people to get through. A projectile is tossed into the crowd. The front lines of each group clash. Violence breaks out. Three gunshots are fired, then two people drop to the ground.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew yanks the glasses off his face and tosses them to the ground. He lowers his head, sighs and takes two deep breaths.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Enough.

Andrew stands and looks intently at the black orb. He grimaces and closes his eyes.

ATHENA (V.O.)

The planet is a singular, connected entity. Only your species has failed to adapt to this reality.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

What's the answer?

ATHENA (V.O.)

Extremism threatens your very existence. Humans must agree on one fundamental truth.

Andrew pauses, then nods. He walks back to his desk, turns and looks back at the black orb.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
You said perhaps it was best this

happened to me. Why?

ATHENA (V.O.)

You're familiar with Joseph Campbell, right?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Coincidentally enough, he spoke to me earlier today.

ATHENA (V.O.)

That's impossible. He's been dead-

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

It was a virtual interaction.

ATHENA (V.O.)

I see. What did you learn?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Our shared commonalities are much greater than our differences.

ATHENA (V.O.)

In the Power of Myth series, Joseph Campbell tells Bill Moyers, "The only myth that is going to be worth thinking about is the one talking about the planet. Not the city, not these people, but the planet and everybody on it".

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I understand.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Do you?

Athena pauses. Andrew looks upward straining for a response.

ATHENA (V.O.)

You are the Father. You are the Son. You were born of an Immaculate Conception. Don't you see? It's you.

Andrew's eyes open wide. He grabs the desk for balance as he abruptly drops into the chair.

EXT. RESTAURANT DINING PATIO - DAY

Claude, Darius and the Minister of Health eat brunch on a sunny day. The restaurant is filled with other patrons. The Minister of Health puts her fork down and leans towards Claude and Darius.

MINISTER OF HEALTH You know there is zero margin for error.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Everyone understands.

The Minister of Health nods. A mid-40's man dressed in a black sport coat, grey slacks and a white button-down shirt approaches the table. He pulls the empty chair aside and puts both hands on the table.

MAN

I was sent with a very important message. Robert's death was not an accident. Neither will Andrew's.

The man takes his hands off the table, gazes quickly at each man.

MAN (CONT'D)

Now it shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established on the top of the mountains.

The man turns and quickly walks away. Claude quickly rises from his chair and takes a step to follow the man. The Minister of Health raises her hand.

MINISTER OF HEALTH Not here. Pull the car around.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT BATHROOM - DAY

Andrew stands in front of the sink gazing into the mirror. His eyes are wide open and mouth agape. Each successive breath becomes deeper. A slight grin appears on his face. His eyes close.

ATHENA (V.O.)
Andrew, are you okay? Your vitals have spiked again.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I'm fine. Thank you Athena...for everything.

Andrew walks out of the bathroom.

EXT. MOUNT OLIVET CEMETARY - DAY

Andrew walks along a path lined with gravestones and markers. He stops 10 feet from his father's memorial, takes a deep breath, then continues. Andrew kneels down and gently puts his hand on the marker which reads "Dr. Robert Stevens June, 21, 1970 - July 7, 2000. Loving husband and father devoted to changing the world".

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
Thank you father. Our legacy will continue.

Andrew gets up and takes out his cell phone. He sends a text message to his mother. "Meet me at the Arboretum. I love you".

INT. LAKE HOUSE LIVING ROOM - DAY

Mary Anne sits on the couch staring at the lake. Her phone lights up as it vibrates. She quickly grabs it and reads the message. Her face lights up as she types "I love you too. Will be there in 20".

EXT. NATIONAL ARBORETUM PARKING LOT - DAY

Mary Anne drives in and parks.

INT. MARY ANNE'S CAR, NOT MOVING - DAY

She sits motionless for a few seconds, then reaches into her purse and pulls out her wallet. She opens it and looks at a an old polaroid picture of her and Robert.

EXT. NATIONAL ARBORETUM - DAY

Mary Anne walks along a tree-lined path and sees Andrew sitting on a bench. She smiles and picks up her pace.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Andrew!

Andrew gets up hurries toward her. They open their arms and embrace. She speaks directly into his ear.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D)

Oh Andrew. I'm so sorry.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I understand. I'm okay now.

Mary Anne and Andrew let go of one another and look deeply into each other's eyes.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I was so worried.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I'm sorry I didn't respond. I needed some...time to reflect.

Mary Anne wipes away a tear, gently smiles and speaks softly.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Of course.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Things will never be the same.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I tried to honor his request, but I couldn't keep lying to you.

Andrew smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Thank you for telling me the truth.

I know my destiny now.

Andrew hugs Mary Anne again and speaks softly in her ear.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

I can only imagine how hard this has been for you. Everything will

be okay. I promise.

Mary Anne closes her eyes and nods.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Claude and Darius said they control nothing.

Andrew pulls away from their embrace.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS What did they tell you?

MARY ANNE STEVENS
The truth would ruin the NIH and
Robert's legacy.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I won't let that happen.

Mary Anne gently grabs ahold of Andrew's hand.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
I can't stop thinking about Robert
fearing for his life. I can't lose
you too.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

From Athena's POV, Andrew comes up the final two steps and looks at the camera. The light changes from red to green as the door unlocks.

ATHENA (V.O.) Welcome home Andrew.

Andrew enters the living room. He puts on his black sport coat as he walks to his desk. Andrew opens the drawer and takes out the silver crucifix necklace. He lowers his head and puts it on slowly.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Please change theme and prepare sermon 28.

The artwork changes as Andrew sits down. He looks at the black orb on the far wall.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Start in five seconds.

From Athena's POV, a red light blinks four times. Andrew sits up taller in his chair. The light goes from red to green. Andrew inhales and exhales deeply.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

Today I bring a message of enlightenment. The war isn't between science and religion, it's with the truth. Opportunistic people lie in pursuit of power and money. Religious extremists use scripture to justify culture wars for selfish reasons. The Bible is a book of parables meant to provide us a moral code to live by, not to be interpreted as literal fact.

Humans explain the unexplainable... for our own sanity.

Our biggest mystery has been answered with certainty since the beginning of time. The truth is, we don't know what happens when we die.

If we don't accept this reality as a unifying truth, infighting will destroy us.

Our mission is global unity, cooperation and peace, just as Jesus taught. Ask yourself, how far have we strayed from the His teachings?

Spirituality is integral to the human condition. I bring a message of love, acceptance of all, faith in the goodness of people and a celebration of humanity's shared origins.

Andrew pauses, glances upward, then straight ahead. He takes a deep breath.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D) Help me spread the message of truth. Show the light to those in the dark.

From Romans 12, verse 2, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind".

We have just one story. Our story. (MORE)

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (CONT'D)

There is but one truth. Our One Truth.

God be with you all. Amen.

INT. NIH CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

Claude, Darius and The Minister of Health sit at the table with Andrew's hologram in the center finishing sermon 28.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS HOLOGRAM

We have just one story. Our story. There is but one truth. Our One Truth.

God be with you all. Amen.

Claude and Darius are motionless. The Minister of Health puts her right hand to her brow as she lowers and shakes her head.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

Holy shit.

The Minister of Health's phone sits on the table. It lights up as it vibrates. "202-555-1299" shows on the display. They watch it vibrate for a few seconds before The Minister of Health answers the call.

MINISTER OF HEALTH (CONT'D)

Who's this?

MAN 1 (V.O.)

That's not important. Our emissary tried to warn you.

The Minister of Health jumps out of seat and leans towards the phone.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

You fucking murderers!

MAN 1 (V.O.)

Until today, we shared a keen interest in Andrew, just for different reasons.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

Look at the benefits this project created for humanity. Are you only interested in helping people when it helps you? MAN 1 (V.O.)

We know good and evil better than anyone. We'll do anything to preserve our place in the world order.

MINISTER OF HEALTH Do you really think you're still that relevant?

MAN 1 (V.O.)

We will not have <u>any</u> lose ends. If people lose faith, we lose everything.

The phone changes to the home screen. Claude and Darius stand up. Claude bends over the table with his fists clenched. He raises them up simultaneously, then slams them on the table.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
Jesus fucking Christ! These radical
bastards want to kill us all.

Claude's eyes well up with tears as he turns and walks to the window.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (CONT'D) We did this for good.

The Minister of Health walks to Claude and gently puts her hand on his shoulder.

MINISTER OF HEALTH We've got to protect Andrew, as well as ourselves.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS There's got to be a way.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew smiles and looks upward.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Thank you, Father.

Andrew takes a deep breath and exhales slowly. He turns his chair around and looks at the picture of he with his mother and sister, then the picture of he with Claude and Darius.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.) You have much to learn and much to accomplish. See the truth.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Sermon 28 is my favorite.

Andrew smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Mine too.

ATHENA (V.O.)

How do you think Claude and Darius will like it?

Andrew raises an eyebrow and cocks his head.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I think they'll be proud.

INT. NIH CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

The Minister of Health gazes out the window and Claude and Darius are sitting at the table, deep in thought. Darius's phone vibrates. He grabs it from the breast pocket of his blazer.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

It's Mary Anne.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

She needs to know. Now.

Darius answers the phone and places it on the table.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

You're on speaker with Claude.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Have you seen it yet?

Claude and Darius quickly make eye contact. Claude nods.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Yes. But there is something you need to know. We learned today Robert's death wasn't an accident. He was murdered. Religious extremists believed cloning a human

would destroy them.

Mary Anne gasps.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

I've had my suspicions for 25 years.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS What? Why didn't you tell us?

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) Robert left me a complete duplicate set of the science and disclosed he

feared for his life.

Everyone's eyes bolt open. Darius quickly grabs the phone and brings it towards him.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS You don't understand what's at stake. Everyone's life is at risk including Hannah's.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
This escalated very quickly. We are doing everything we can. Just stay right where you are.

Darius hangs up the call.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

We need to buy some time.

The Minister of Health taps a message to her most recent call, "Mary Anne has a second set of the science and will release it if anything happens. She'll take everyone down".

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew stands at the window gazing at the horizon.

ATHENA (V.O.)

It seems sermon 28 was not just our favorite. It's already been viewed over 300,000 times.

Andrew turns away from the window and looks at the black orb.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

How many did sermon 27 have?

ATHENA (V.O.)

23,469.

Andrew turns away from the window and walks to his desk and sits down. He leans forward toward the black orb.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
There's something I haven't told
you. My father feared for his life
before he died.

Andrew waits patiently for a response.

ATHENA

Have you considered who would have the most to lose by cloning a human?

Andrew's eyes bolt open.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Oh my God. Call Darius.

Two pulsating tones ring.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (V.O.) Hello Andrew. We were just about to call you.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS And tell me my father was murdered?

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS We just learned this today. None of us are safe.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I won't let that happen. I have an idea.

EXT. LAKE HOUSE BACK DECK - DAY

Mary Anne paces back and forth. Hannah opens the sliding glass door and pokes her head out.

HANNAH STEVENS

Mom, are you okay?

Mary Anne stops and turns to face Hannah.

MARY ANNE STEVENS I'm sorry. It's been a couple of pretty emotional days.

Hannah nods.

HANNAH STEVENS
It has, but in a good way. Andrew's got such a bright future.

Mary Anne's lip quivers.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Your right. He does.

Mary Anne walks off the back deck and down a small flight of stairs onto a stone path lined with large rocks. She picks up a rock, turns it over and pulls out a key from a secret compartment. She looks toward the cellar door 15 feet away.

INT. LAKE HOUSE CELLAR - DAY

The door creaks as it slowly opens. The cellar is full of stuff but neatly organized. Mary Anne enters and walks to the far right corner. She moves several boxes off the far wall revealing an antique cabinet. She reaches down, opens the bottom drawer and pulls out the yellow folder.

INT. NIH CONFERENCE ROOM - DAY

Claude, Darius and The Minister of Health sit at the table. The Minister of Health stands up and looks at Darius, then Claude.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

This is our only option.

The Minister of Health walks out and closes the door. Darius turns toward Claude.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Let's get to work.

Darius looks at a small black orb in the upper corner of the conference room.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D)

Apollo, retrieve the BMD Jane Doe database.

APOLLO (V.O.)

Very well sir.

A 3-D image of a large manila folder appears and hovers above the table. The folder is titled "NIH Benevolent Medical Division".

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Delete minors and anyone over 35 years old.

The file opens and blurs as data shuffles.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) Sort by date of death.

The data shuffles showing three names. Claude and Darius lean in closer to examine the list.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
That's her. Text Andrew and tell
him we'll be there in 45 minutes.

Darius pulls out his phone and types a message.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Apollo, please delete search history and close.

The NIH BMD three dimensional folder disappears. Darius turns to Claude.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) God, I hope this works.

INT. ANDREW STEVENS CAR, MOVING - DAY

Andrew drives along Independence Way SW. He looks to his right at the Washington Monument. He takes a right turn on Raoul Wallenberg Place SW and parks just past the Holocaust Memorial Museum. Andrew sees Claude and Darius standing on the curb in front of the museum among scores of people.

EXT. STREETS OF WASHINGTON, DC - DAY

Andrew gets out of his car as Claude and Darius approach.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Good afternoon, gentlemen.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Hello Andrew. It's good to see you again.

Claude and Darius turn and walk back toward the Holocaust Museum. Andrew catches up and walks between them. They speak softly to keep the conversation private.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D) We thought this would be an appropriate place to meet.

Andrew politely nods.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D)
Do you know how many people died in
World War II?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Tens of millions.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
Between 50 and 85 million. That's a
margin of error of 35 million
lives. That's how bad it was.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
The majority of the casualties were civilians in China and the Soviet
Union. It was the *only* use of nuclear weapons in war.

It was an epic battle between good and evil. Humanity was forced to choose a side. The arc of human history was forever changed by the sacrifices of brave men and women. Their individual sacrifices were enormous. The collective sacrifice was impactful beyond anyone's imagination. Your sacrifice may be every bit as consequential to humanity.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
Please promise me two things. One,
you'll do everything in your power
to keep my Mom and sister safe. And
two, just as you did for my father,
make sure my message doesn't end
with me.

Claude and Darius respectfully nod.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Absolutely.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We are your disciples.

Darius hands Andrew a set of car keys.

 $$\operatorname{\textsc{DR.DARIUS}}$ REYNOLDS It's in the far left corner of the lot.

Andrew steps forward and extends his arms toward Darius. They embrace. He then hugs Claude, turns and walks away.

EXT. EVENS MAINE PARKING LOT - DAY

The parking lot is almost totally filled with cars. Andrew walks toward the far back corner and spots a gray late model sedan. His pace quickens. He pushes a button on the key fob and opens the door. A woman with blood all over her blouse is slumped over in the front passenger seat. A bloody knife rests on the center console.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

From Athena's POV, Andrew steps onto the landing. The diagnostic gauges are way above normal. The red light turns green as the door unlocks. Andrew opens the door and enters the apartment.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Are you okay? Your vitals are-

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

I'm fine.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Is there anything I can do?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

No.

Andrew picks up his phone and dials.

EXT. LAKE HOUSE BACK DECK - DAY

Mary Anne sits alone looking at the lake. Her phone lights up and vibrates. She grabs the phone as fast as possible.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Andrew!... Andrew?!

Andrew stammers.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.)

Hello mother.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Are you okay?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.)

Yes, but I learned my father was murdered, and those same people would kill again.

MARY ANNE STEVENS What if we left tonight? They'd never find us.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) I know my purpose. I can't run from it. I just want you and Hannah to be safe. Please trust me.

Mary Anne's eyes well up with tears.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Oh God Andrew. No, please no.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) No matter what happens, you will know the truth. That's all that matters. Do you understand?

Mary Anne shakes her head and raises her voice.

MARY ANNE STEVENS No. I don't understand!

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) You will soon.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Andrew, I'm so scared. I can't lose you.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) I need you to promise me something. No matter what, <u>never</u> release the yellow folder. My father's legacy is too important.

Tears are streaming down Mary Anne's cheeks.

MARY ANNE STEVENS Tell me what's happening.

 $$\operatorname{DR.}$ ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) Please promise me mother.

Mary Anne grimaces and slowly nods her head, barely able to speak.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I promise.

 $$\operatorname{DR.}$ ANDREW STEVENS (V.O.) Thank you. I love you.

Mary Anne begins sobbing.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

No... No!

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Andrew lowers his phone and gently lays it on the desk. He reaches into the desk drawer and pulls out the silver crucifix necklace and puts it over his head.

ATHENA (V.O.)

Andrew, are you expecting anyone?

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Actually, yes.

INT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

From Athena's POV, Claude and Darius stand at the doorway. The diagnostic gauges are above normal. They look at the camera. The light goes from red to green as the door unlocks. Darius opens the door and the two men enter together in lockstep. Andrew sits at the desk staring straight ahead.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

We are here on authority from the Honorable G. H. Cirillo, judge for the District of Columbia Superior Court. You are under arrest for the murder of Rachel Chase.

Andrew stares at the photos then slowly turns his chair to face his accusers. He stands and stares at them.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER

Andrew, please come with us.

Andrew smiles and nods. He extends his arms and tilts his head back forming a cross.

EXT. ANDREW'S APARTMENT - DAY

Claude, Darius and Andrew come down the final steps as several cars and a few pedestrians enter the complex. Andrew looks at the ground, oblivious to the increasing activity.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Let's go Andrew. We need to hurry.

They pick up their pace as they approach the car. A mid-20's male visitor pulls out his phone and points it at Andrew.

VISITOR

It's him. Andrew!

Several other people reach for their phones. From the handheld footage, Claude opens the door and gets Andrew in the car. Darius avoids eye contact as he gets into the car. They drive away and down the street as more cars enter Andrew's parking lot.

INT. DARIUS REYNOLDS CAR, MOVING - DAY

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Damn it.

Darius looks at Claude and shakes his head.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS (CONT'D)

Update her.

Claude takes out his phone and types "Acquisition done. Unwanted attention. 10 minutes".

INT. NIH CONSULTATION ROOM - DAY

Claude, Darius and Andrew enter a dimly lit room with no windows and nothing on the walls. There is a rectangular table with four chairs, three on one side and one on the other. A two inch diameter black orb is in the far upper corner of the room.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER

Please, sit down.

Andrew makes his way to the chair opposite the other three and sits. Claude and Darius remain standing. Andrew blankly stares at them. Claude's device buzzes, he pulls it out and sees "Here".

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (CONT'D)

There's someone we'd like you to meet.

Claude opens the door. The Minister of Health stands in the doorway.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS
This is the honorable G. H.
Cirillo, judge for the District of
Columbia Superior Court.

MINISTER OF HEALTH Hello Andrew. I know this has been a hard day for you.

Andrew stares at her blankly.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS This was the only way.

MINISTER OF HEALTH
Thank you for doing the right
thing. I'm sure your father would
have done the same.

Andrew nods.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
Your sacrifice won't be in vain.

Andrew looks at Claude and Darius and smiles.

MINISTER OF HEALTH
The project... you... were born
from the idea that human cloning
could help humanity. That is now a
fact.

This technology could be used for unimaginable evil if it fell into the wrong hands.

Andrew nods.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Apollo, begin recording.

APOLLO (V.O.)

Recording.

MINISTER OF HEALTH
We deeply believe in due process
and the rule of law. You have the
right to a phone call and legal
representation.

Andrew shakes his head.

MINISTER OF HEALTH (CONT'D)
Under the authority granted to me
by the District of Columbia
Superior Court, you are charged
with the murder of Rachel Chase.
The evidence, including your DNA,
is irrefutable. How do you plead?

Andrew takes a deep breath and leans forward.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Innocent... by reason of insanity.

The Minister of Health grins.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

Very well. Apollo, stop recording and archive.

APOLLO (V.O.)

Done.

The Minister of Health pulls out his phone and dials.

MAN 1

Minister.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

Andrew has just admitted to a murder. He was temporarily insane. We believe this solves our problem.

MAN 1

Very well, but a person innocent by reason of insanity must be insane.

MINISTER OF HEALTH

Understood.

The Minister of Health hangs up. Andrew turns his attention to Claude and Darius and stoically nods his head.

MINISTER OF HEALTH (CONT'D)

There's just one last thing.

The Minister of Health turns and looks at Claude.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER

Apollo, please call Mary Anne Stevens.

APOLLO (V.O.)

Dialing.

The phone rings on speaker.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Hello.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Hello Mary Anne. It's Darius. You're on speaker with Claude and Andrew. There's something Andrew wants to tell you.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Hello Mother. I'm so sorry. I've confessed to a horrible crime. I was temporarily insane.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) Oh my God. No!

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
It's done. It was the only way to keep everyone and my message alive.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS When this changed from protecting the NIH's reputation and Robert's legacy to a matter of life and death, Andrew sacrificed himself.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
I love you. Thank you for
everything. I will see you again.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

No!

The Minister of Health takes her left hand and waves it from right to left at the black orb.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) Please don't hang up. This can't-

CUT TO BLACK.

TITLE: FIVE YEARS LATER

INT. LAKE HOUSE LIVING ROOM - DAY

Mary Anne stares out into space. Hannah's mouth is agape as a tear rolls down her cheek.

MARY ANNE STEVENS I'm sorry I couldn't tell you sooner.

Mary Anne moves over to Hannah and gives her a hug. Hannah struggles to speak.

HANNAH STEVENS Oh my God. I'm so sorry.

Mary Anne slowly pulls away from Hannah and looks lovingly into her eyes.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
I wanted so badly to tell you
Andrew didn't kill that woman. You
were all I had left.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - DAY

Andrew bows his head with his hands covering his face. He slowly lifts his head and pulls back his long hair.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Are you sure this is what you want?

Andrew stares at them blankly.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS

Yes.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS There's just one last thing. We need to end this once and for all.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Please call Mary Anne and ask her to bring the file.

Andrew smiles slightly as his eyes open wider.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Apollo, please call Mary Anne Stevens.

APOLLO (V.O.)

Dialing.

They wait motionless. After two rings there's a soft click, then silence.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS

Hello. Mary Anne?

Mary Anne's tone is soft and sullen.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.)

Yes.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS You're on speaker with Claude and Dr. Stevens. He'd like to speak with you.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS Hello mother, it's Robert.

Mary Anne gasps and takes a second to respond.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (V.O.) It's so good to hear your voice. I've missed you so much.

Andrew smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS
Me too. They need you to bring the yellow folder.

Claude leans forward.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
You have an unprecedented
opportunity to grant the same man
another last wish. A car will be
there in 10 minutes.

They wait for a response but there is only silence.

INT. LAKE HOUSE LIVING ROOM - DAY

Mary Anne slowly reaches toward her phone on the coffee table then pushes a button to hang up. She turns to face Hannah.

HANNAH STEVENS

Can I come?

MARY ANNE STEVENS
No, this is something I need to do alone.

Hannah nods.

HANNAH STEVENS I understand. Give my love to Andrew.

Mary Anne nods, then gets up from the couch. She walks to the back door, opens it and goes outside.

EXT. LAKE HOUSE FRONT PORCH - DUSK

The front door opens. Mary Anne carries the yellow folder and walks toward a black SUV. The driver opens the rear passenger door. After Mary Anne gets in, the driver closes her door and gets in. He drives slowly down the driveway and into the setting sun.

EXT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH - NIGHT

The SUV pulls around and stops at the main entrance. Mary Anne gets out and walks to the entrance as several people exit the building.

INT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH LOBBY - NIGHT

Claude and Darius stand in the lobby. Mary Anne walks in holding the yellow folder. Claude politely nods.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Everyone appreciates you being here.

Mary Anne nods.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS We'd like to have a few words with you first. Please follow us.

Claude and Darius walk to the elevator as Mary Anne follows. Once the door opens, they enter and Darius looks into a facial recognition scanner. He pushes the button for the bottom floor as the door closes.

INT. NIH BASEMENT - NIGHT

The elevator door opens. Mary Anne exits first, then Claude and Darius emerge into a stark white, barren hallway without any pictures or windows. There is an empty nurse station with a monitor mounted on the far wall. A CNN newscast mentions something about a global climate accord.

They turn right down an adjacent hallway and approach a closed door. Claude looks into a facial recognition scanner. A pneumatic seal releases pressure. The door drops straight down and disappears. Darius opens his palm and extends his arm.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Please, have a seat.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - NIGHT

Mary Anne walks slowly to the chair and sits as Claude and Darius follow and take their seats.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We know you've been through hell.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
I'm more concerned about Andrew than myself.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER We understand.

Darius leans toward Mary Anne.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS We need to prepare you. Andrew's not the same.

MARY ANNE STEVENS What have you done to him?

Claude and Darius glance at one another then back to Mary Anne.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Once we found out Robert was murdered, we did the only thing possible to keep everyone else alive.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER
We know you did what you thought
was best. Your decision set in
motion events even Robert couldn't
have foreseen.

Darius leans further toward Mary Anne.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Never has an individual's life had such consequence.

Mary Anne's eyes well up with tears. She gently nods.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER Can I ask you a question?

Mary Anne nods.

DR. CLAUDE FRAZIER (CONT'D) Would you have ever released the folder?

Mary Anne gently puts the yellow folder on the table in front of Claude and Darius.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
No. I made a promise to Andrew and
I couldn't do that to Robert's
legacy.

Claude and Darius nod.

DR. DARIUS REYNOLDS Are you ready?

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Yes.

INT. NIH BASEMENT - NIGHT

Mary Anne, Claude and Darius walk down the hallway. They stop in front of Andrew's door. Darius looks into the facial recognition scanner and the two men step aside.

INT. SMALL ROOM INSIDE NIH - NIGHT

Andrew stands in front of a mirror staring deeply at his reflection. The red light above his door flashes and buzzes three times. A pressure seal releases as the door drops straight down. Andrew turns and sees Mary Anne standing in the doorway. He looks at her in disbelief.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

Hello doctor.

Andrew's eyes light up. Mary Anne smiles and hurries over to him. As she approaches, they both open their arms and hug with all their might. Mary Anne softly whispers in his ear as she chokes back tears.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) We've missed you so much. Hannah sends her love.

Andrew and Mary Anne separate.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I knew I'd see you again. I've thought about you every day.

Mary Anne smiles and nods. She puts a hand on each of Andrew's shoulders, pulls him closer and looks deeply into his eyes.

MARY ANNE STEVENS
We did it. I'm so proud of you.

A tear falls from Andrew's left eye as he gently smiles.

DR. ANDREW STEVENS I want to join my father.

Mary Anne swallows hard.

MARY ANNE STEVENS

I understand.

She reaches behind her neck, lowers her head and pulls off a silver crucifix necklace with two concentric circles centered on the intersection of the cross. She pauses for a moment, then puts it over Andrew's head.

MARY ANNE STEVENS (CONT'D) You're the only man I've ever loved. I will see you again. Goodbye doctor.

Mary Anne leans forward and kisses him on the cheek.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - NIGHT

Mary Anne stands at the doorway. Claude and Darius sit motionless. She walks into the room and sits down.

 $$\operatorname{\textsc{DR.}}$ DARIUS REYNOLDS Are you ready?

Mary Anne nods. A black curtain moves from left to right revealing a 6 foot by 6 foot two-way mirror. Mary Anne turns her chair 180 degrees. Andrew sits on his bed clutching the Our One Truth crucifix. He mutters to himself with his head bowed. The red light above his door flashes three times. The door drops straight down and disappears.

INT. SMALL ROOM INSIDE NIH - NIGHT

Andrew stands and turns toward the door. The orderly stands in the doorway holding a small glass of bluish fluid.

ORDERLY Good evening Dr. Stevens.

Andrew smiles and nods. The orderly walks toward him and stops a few feet away.

ORDERLY (CONT'D)
It's been an honor. Thank you for everything.

The orderly extends the glass with both hands toward Andrew. They both clutch the glass for a second before the orderly lets go. Andrew takes notice of a pin on the orderly's shirt pocket. It is a cross with two concentric circles, identical to the necklace his mother just gave him.

ORDERLY (CONT'D) Goodbye Dr. Stevens.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - NIGHT

Claude, Darius and Mary Anne sit motionless. Andrew looks up at the ceiling. His lips mouth the words "Thank you Father", before lifting the glass to his lips. Andrew drinks it in two gulps. He sets the glass down on the nightstand then turns toward the mirrored glass. He stares at the glass for a couple of seconds then walks forward.

INT. SMALL ROOM INSIDE NIH - NIGHT

Andrew gazes deeply into the mirrored glass. His reflection fades away and is replaced by visions and hallucinations; some actual memories, some aspirations and some complete insanity. He sees his mother smiling in a beautiful floral dress. Andrew reaches up and gently places his hand on the glass caressing her face.

INT. NIH OBSERVATION ROOM - NIGHT

Mary Anne gets up from her seat and walks to the glass. She puts her hand opposite Andrew's. She looks straight into his eyes. Andrew's hand begins to slide down as Mary Anne's traces his as it slowly drops. Andrew's head wobbles slightly as his eyes lose focus. His hand slips down further. Mary Anne's hand traces Andrew's the entire way down the glass. Andrew collapses to the ground. Mary Anne is on her knees with her hands over her face crying.

After a couple seconds, she gains her composure, gets up and slowly walks out of the room. Darius picks up his device and taps a message. Claude grabs the yellow folder, then they both exit the observation room. They pause and watch Mary Anne walk down the hallway. She stops at the empty nurse station and takes notice of the CNN newscast.

CNN ANCHOR (V.O.)

This breaking news just in from our Twitter feed, famed theologian, Dr. Andrew Stevens, has died peacefully tonight at the NIH surrounded by family and friends. Long the subject of conspiracy theories, his contributions, and those of his father's, are immeasurable. His ministry, Our One Truth, is the fastest growing spiritual movement on the planet with 2.3 billion followers. Many have said the world hasn't seen anyone like him since Jesus Christ.

Mary Anne continues down the hallway and gets into the elevator. Once the door closes, Claude and Darius turn and exit through an adjacent door.

INT. NIH CREMATORY - NIGHT

Claude and Darius enter the crematory. The blue folder sits on a staging table in front of an incinerator. Darius opens the incinerator, ablaze with intense flames. He picks up the blue folder, then he and Claude simultaneously toss them into the incinerator. They watch the folders ignite and burn for several seconds before closing the door.

EXT. NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH - NIGHT

Mary Anne walks out of the building and gets into the SUV. It slowly pulls out of the NIH entrance and drives off. The POV pulls back revealing the streets of DC, the entire District of Columbia, the eastern seaboard, the United States, and ultimately the planet from the famous "Earth Rise" photo from the moon.

FADE OUT.
